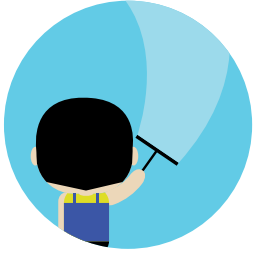
Māori Television will also be broadcasting te reo educational programmes (for ages 2 to 18) from 9am to 3pm on schooldays.

## Horoi whare

Lots of learning is done when kids help out around the house.



## Paanui pukapuka

Reading a book together is a great way to support kids learning.



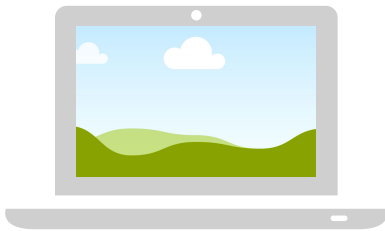
## Taakaro keemu

Lots of learning is done just through having fun and playing games.



## Tamariki take the lead

When the kids express and interest in something take the opportunity and spend 20mins with them on it. This is real learning time.



## Waahi ako

For older kids with school work to do, try and create a dedicated space and time for them to do this.



## Tunu kai

Getting the kids to help with baking or cooking dinner is a great way for them to develop skills.



## Hiikoi

Going on a hiikoi together is a good for your exercise and good for the kids. Remember social distancing and to stay local.



## Korikori tinana

Time up the driveway or in the yard throwing or kicking a ball around is good for everyone.



## Whakaweto

Make sure the kids get device free time everyday.
