Criteria

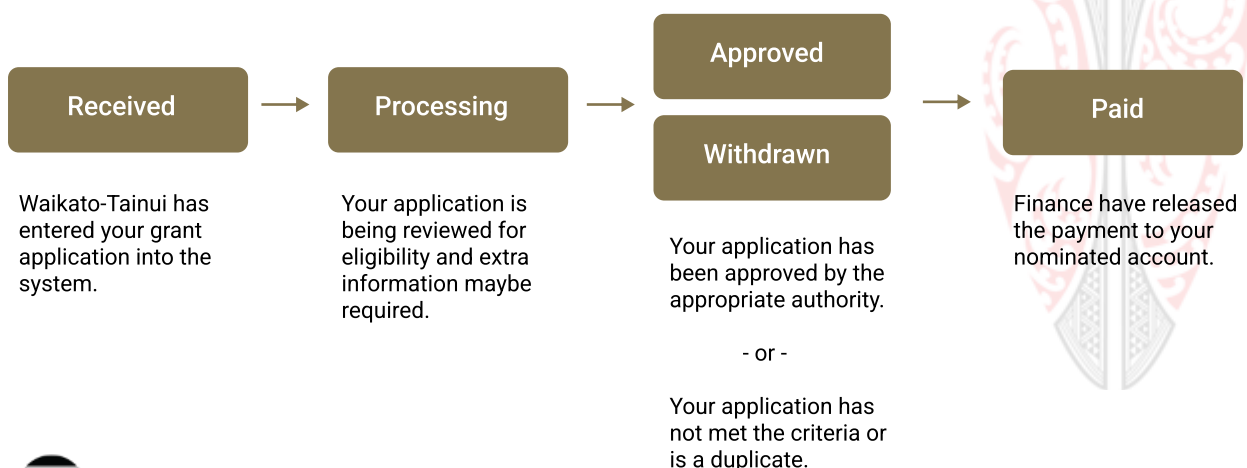
- ☐ Endorsement from Marae and/or mana whenua, dependant on the outline of your project.

- ☐ Full details of the project including expected outcomes, dates, venues, proposed benefits and budget.
- ☐ Regular reports and evidence of success for previously awarded Taiao grants.

Only one grant application is available per individual or organisation in any financial year period.

Sole discretion to accept, withdraw or decline a grant application that does not meet criteria rests with us. Decisions are final and no correspondence will be entered into. Incomplete applications will be withdrawn after 60 days and a new application form needs to be completed.

Grant application process

Most grant application payments take up to 8 weeks for processing, approval and payment (if approved). Payment is due on the 21st of each month.

Taiao Grant – Appendix A

Te Whakakitenga o Waikato Incorporated ("we", "us" or "Waikato-Tainui")

Priority Areas – Supporting Information

Kia Tupu – To Grow

Grants to assist in the growth and building of knowledge, capacity and capability to practice kaitiakitanga. Projects or initiatives may include waananga, learning opportunities, environmental knowledge transfer initiatives, cadetships, internships, and so forth. Projects may also include opportunities to increase sector knowledge and capability including mentoring services, environmental report writing, monitoring tools, data analysis, Taiao forums, tools to respond to Resource Consent applications, hapuu or marae environmental plan writing.

Kia Hua – To Prosper

Grants to assist tribal members and marae in their environmental aspirations so they can look towards a prosperous future in their environments. Projects or initiatives may include research and development of innovative technologies or tools, support to establish environmental practices, start-up funds for environmental practitioners, and so forth. Projects may also include restoration programmes that concentrate on improved environmental outcomes in a range of environments including taonga species, freshwater, storm water, grey water, maara kai and nurseries.

Kia Puaawai – To Sustain

Grants to assist tribal members and marae in continuing their roles at Kaitiaki in protecting current environments. Projects may include protection of taonga species, environmental restoration projects and resource consent submissions.
